Friends at PORAC, CPOA, CSSA, and CPCA,

Yesterday we released a short 16 minute video on AB 392. The video is very cut and dry and simply addresses the new law compared to the existing law. I don't know how else to say it, but it is very black and white, so to speak. Our goal was simply to get the message out as to what has changed, and to get the message out as quickly as possible. We have been getting lots of questions over the last month about AB 392 and what we were intending to do with training, and I think the video hits the mark as the starter.

Also, in the next week we will be rolling out an AB 392 training course for agencies to use. The course is essentially done and we are just putting the final touches on today. The course is two hours long and we categorize it as a "course in a box:" agencies simply download the curriculum as is, and teach it as many times as they want, and as often as they want (the more the better). The two-hour course is also very concise and to the point.

Lastly, next year we will roll out an eight-hour use of force course pursuant to the requirements in SB 230, and that course will be 50% in the classroom and 50% behind a simulator. We intend to capture into that eight-hour course everything related to AB 392 and SB 230, as well integrate many de-escalation topics.

In August 2019 AB 392 was signed into law. Effective January 1, 2020, the bill will change legal standards for California peace officers' use of force, including justifiable homicide and deadly force.
