

### **San Bernardino**

#### Chino Valley -

School Board proposed a district policy that would force schools to inform parents if their child identifies as transgender

City of San Bernardino violated rights of homeless residents living in parks & violated its duties under the Americans with Disabilities Act





#### **Riverside**

#### Temecula -

residents sued the Temecula Valley Unified School District, its Board of Trustees, and its president, for violating their rights under the First Amendment and California law by ejecting them from school board meetings without cause. The ACLU Foundation of Southern California and the First Amendment Coalition are representing the Temecula residents.

Riverside County – Amid jail deaths, Riverside County will study separating coroner from sheriff


#### **Voter supported justice reforms:**

- Prop 36 Reformed "Three Strikes Law"
- Prop 47 Changed some felonies to misdemeanors
- Prop 57 Increased access to parole and juvenile justice
- Prop 64 Legalized adult use of marijuana
- LA County PARP Move to zerobail





- Crime is down across California
- Property crime and recidivism are lower post-Prop 47 and Prop 57
- Houselessness, mental health crises, and addiction are up
- Local governments continue to prioritize increased funding for law enforcement
- Attempts to roll back criminal legal reforms through misinformation

#### You are eligible to vote if you are:

- A United States citizen and a resident of California
- 18 years old or older on Election
   Day
- Not currently in state or federal prison for the conviction of a felony
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court.





#### You are eligible to vote if you are:

- Unhoused
- Serving a misdemeanor or felony jail sentence in a local detention facility
- On probation, parole, mandatory supervision, post-release community supervision, or federal supervised release



#### **CA Voter's Choice Act (VCA)**

- Optional by county
- Offers more flexible voting opportunities to voters in participating counties
- Expanded early voting
- Replaced traditional polling places

#### **CA Voter's Choice Act (VCA)**

- Created additional, more accessible ways to vote:
  - By mail
  - At a secure ballot drop box (28 days before Election Day)
  - At any vote center in the county of residence (10 days before Election Day)
- Participating SoCal counties:
  - Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, Ventura

#### **Important Dates**

February 5th – VBM ballots sent

February 6th – Ballot drop-off locations open

February 20th – Last day to register to vote before election day

February 24th – Vote centers open for early in-person voting (VCA counties)

March 5th – Election Day; last day to drop off or mail ballots

#### ABORTION AND CONTRACEPTION ACCESS PROTECTIONS

Proposition 1 amends the state constitution to affirm as strongly as possible Californians' rights to access abortion and contraception. Prop. 1 will enshrine existing privacy and equal protection guarantees around reproductive health in our state constitution.

Abortion and contraception access fights are part of a larger movement towards true reproductive justice, which means that everyone has the right to make their own decisions about their lives, families, and futures.



#### SHERIFF ACCOUNTABILITY

Measure A amends the L.A. County Charter to keep the sheriff accountable by authorizing the removal of a sheriff if they commit serious violations of the public trust — such as breaking the law, lying in official statements, obstructing investigations into deputy misconduct, or failing to stop deputy gangs from brutalizing our communities.

The county has a long history of sheriffs abusing power, disregarding the law, and obstructing civilian oversight. These issues go deeper than just one sheriff. Measure A finally establishes long-overdue checks and balances to hold our sheriff accountable, because no sheriff should be above the law.



#### AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND SUPPORT

Measure ULA establishes a mansion tax for millionaires and molfillonaires in the City of Los Angeles that would reduce houselessness by buying, building, and preserving affordable houselessness by buying, building, and preserving affordable houselessness and disabled people who are in danger of losing their homes, and making the most significant investment in tenant protections in the city's history to ensure that Angelenos can stay housed.

This measure was written by L.A.'s not-for-profit houselessness and housing experts — not politicians. It will also institute strong oversight with an independent board of experts and a dedicated inspector general to ensure immediate and concrete results.



#### RENT CONTROL AND PROTECTIONS AGAINST EVICTIONS

Measure H establishes rent control in the City of Pasadena, enacts "just cause" eviction protections to reduce housing displacement, creates an independent rental housing board to preserve affordable housing and implement tenant protections and provides for relocation benefits under certain circumstances.

California's housing crisis impacts renters, homeowners, middle-income families, and low-income families in different ways. With increasing rent, stagnant wages, a continuing pandemic, and evictions and houselessness on the rise, it's never been more vital to protect renters.


