Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$631,390 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

- Secondary Counselor: \$115,897
- Pupil Services and Attendance Counselor: \$121,443
- Psychiatric Social Worker: \$121,443
- Restorative Justice Teacher Advisor: \$57,948

School Supplies:

• Chrome Book Carts: \$14,659

Professional Development & Pay for Staff:

- Instructional Services Contracts: \$140,000
- Professional Development Time for Teachers: \$20,000
- Teacher X-Time: \$15,000
- Staff Conference Attendance: \$15,000

Resources for Students:

• Software Licenses: \$25,000

The school also has \$191,574 of carryover funds from last year to spend this year. The school must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
