Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$609,760 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

- Instructional Assistant Principal: \$84,320
- Pupil Services & Attendance Counselor: \$60,512
- Community Representative: \$10,000
- Restorative Justice Teacher: \$68,608
- Half-Time Psychiatric Social Worker: \$60,512

Resources for Students:

Professional Development & Pay for Staff:

- Equity Studies Contract: \$98,337
- Substitutes: \$20,000
- Teacher X-Time: \$20,000
- Administrator X-Time: \$8,000

School Supplies:

- General Supplies: \$50,000

Pending Assignment: \$30,471

This school and the School of Arts & Culture have \$1,090,280 of carryover funds from last year to spend this year. The schools must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
