Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$461,440 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

 Pupil Services and Attendance Counselor: \$122,000

Professional Development for Staff:

 Breakthrough Innovation Process, including software programs & Technology Support Assistant: \$216,500

School Supplies:

Technology Equipment: \$120,000

Resources for Students:

Naviance College & Career Readiness: \$2,800

The school also has \$170,168 of carryover funds from last year to spend this year.

The school must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
