\$812,670 for Helen Bernstein High School to serve low-income students, English learners, and foster youth in 2018-19!

Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$812,670 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

- Assistant Principal: \$144,546
- Classroom Size Reduction Math Teacher: \$111,873
- Information Technology Support Technician: \$73,127
- Pupil Services and Attendance Counselor: \$121,026
- Community Representative: \$10,000
- Restorative Justice Teacher Advisor: \$122,000

Professional Development & Pay for Staff:

- College Board Staff Conference Attendance: \$6,201
- Instructional Coach: \$154,532
- English Teacher Professional Development X-Time: \$20,000

Resources for Students or Families:

- Counseling Staff Trainings for Parents: \$2,000

The school also has \$411,698 of carryover funds from last year to spend this year.

The school must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
