\$1,200,980 for John Muir Middle School to serve low-income, English learners, and foster youth in 2018-19!

Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$1,200,980 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

- Math Teacher: \$115,000
- English Teacher: \$115,000
- Pupil Services & Attendance Counselor: \$86,605
- Restorative Justice Teacher: \$86,605

Resources for Students & Families:

- English Intensive Literacy Intervention: \$19,509
- English University Reading Assessment: \$9,500
- Parent Educational Achievement Seminar/Workshops: \$10,000
- Seminars/Workshops for Families Who Support Foster or Homeless Students: \$10,000
- Building Relationships: \$1,000
- 40 Developmental Assets: \$500

Professional Development & Pay for Teachers:

- Achieving Personalized Learning w/ Technology Professional Development: \$196,069
- Long Term English Learner Teaching Foundational Literacy Skills: \$9,283
- District-Level Requirement for Professional Development: \$146,750
- Professional Development (PD) Teacher X-Time: \$60,000
- Administrator X-Time: \$30,000
- Tutor Teacher X-Time: \$60,000
- Math, English, Science, & Social Science Curriculum Planning & Implementation: \$200,000

School Supplies:

- Technology: \$45,150

The school also has \$586,156 of carryover funds from last year to spend this year.

The school must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
