Below is a list of how the Principal plans to spend \$1,197,890 in the 2018-19 school year:

Positions:

- Math Teacher: \$111,873
- English Teacher: \$111,873
- 2 Teacher Assistants: \$17,535
- Pupil Services & Attendance (PSA) Counselor: \$121,022.11
- IT Support Tech: \$73,127
- Librarian: \$60,000
- Psychiatric Social Worker: \$121,441
- Restorative Justice Teacher: \$115,897
- School Supervision Aide: \$35,000

School Supplies & Technology:

- Shmoop Software License Maintenance: \$5,000

Professional Development & Pay for Staff:

- 2 Instructional Coaches: \$231,794
- Contracts for Instructional Services: \$94,000
- PSA Counselor X-Time: \$7,390

Resources for Families:

- Parent Education Contracts (Parent Institute for Quality Education & Project Appleseed): \$11,100

The school also has \$706,634 of carryover from last year to spend this year.

The school must "use it or lose it" so tell your Principal how to spend the money to support high need students!

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, the Community Coalition v. LAUSD lawsuit settlement provides \$150 million of additional funds to 50 middle and high schools in Los Angeles over 3 school years to invest in resources and programs that support high need students.
