The **A.L. Wirin Pro Bono Award** is named for the man widely acknowledged as one of the first pro bono attorneys in the United States. A.L. Wirin worked for years with the ACLU SoCal on a pro bono basis before becoming one of our first staff attorneys in 1933. He argued *Korematsu* and *Yasui* at the Supreme Court and was involved in some of the most important civil rights cases of his time.

The A.L. Wirin Pro Bono Award is given annually to firms whose commitment to supporting our work has been especially profound.
