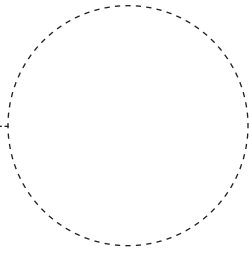

WE KNOW OUR RIGHTS.

- I do not have to let law enforcement into my house, unless they have a valid judicial warrant. Ask them “Do you have a warrant signed by a judge?”
- I do not have to leave my house to talk to law enforcement.
- I have the right to remain silent. I do not have to answer any questions.
- I do not have to identify myself or provide identification, unless I’m being issued a citation.
- I have the right to speak to a lawyer before cooperating with law enforcement.
- I have the right to film and record law enforcement while they are engaged in law enforcement activities.

WE DO NOT CONSENT.

ICE IS NOT WELCOME HERE.



IF LAW ENFORCEMENT IS AT YOUR DOOR...

✓ **VERIFY** who is at the door.

Ask who it is. If it is ICE, remember your rights. Do not let them in without a warrant. Remain silent. Do not identify yourself. Do not show them identification.

If they say they are police, ask:

- *What police department are you from?*
- Ask to see identification. *Do you have a badge or card?* Ask them to slide it under the door.
- *What is your name and title?* Write this down.
- What type of uniform are they wearing? Does their uniform show the insignia of their law enforcement agency? Does the uniform identify what agency they are from? ICE agents often wear plain clothes or a black uniform without anything identifying them as ICE, whereas police officers usually wear uniforms that identify their agency.

Ask them why they are there. *What do you want? Do you have a warrant signed by a judge?*

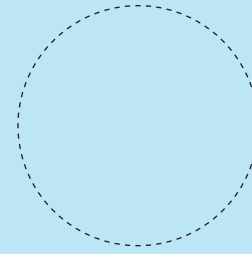
✓ **DOCUMENT** the encounter.

- Record the encounter on video or audio.
- Write down what they said to you.
- Call for someone else in the house to witness the encounter.
- Call a neighbor to watch from the outside.
- Document the details of any search, violence or abuse.

✓ **REPORT** what happened.

Download and use the free Mobile Justice app to record interactions with law enforcement and immigration officials and to send those interactions to the ACLU.

Call your local Rapid Response Network to report the incident and to seek legal assistance, if needed.
