Addendum to Claim Against City of Tustin on Behalf of Kelvin Estiven Hernandez Román

Circumstances giving rise to this claim:

Kelvin Estiven Hernandez Román is a 32-year-old father of two. At the time of this incident, he resided in Garden Grove. At approximately 9:00 on the morning of July 13, 2019, he was driving in the city of Tustin when he was stopped by two Tustin police officers. The officers informed him that they had stopped him because of his car's tinted windows. They ordered him to step outside of his vehicle. Once he was standing outside, one of the officers asked him a series of questions about his immigration status, including, "What country are you from?" and "What is your status?". Mr. Hernandez Roman answered the questions honestly. He also asked the officer why he was asking those questions. The officer responded, "these are routine questions."

The District Attorney declined to file any charges against Mr. Hernandez Román in connection with his arrest.

General description of the indebtedness, obligation, injury, damage or loss incurred so far as you now know:

By questioning Mr. Hernandez Román about his immigration status, the Tustin Police violated his rights under the California Values Act. That Act prohibits local police from "inquiring into an individual's immigration status." Cal. Gov't Code § 7284.6(a)(1)(A).

The officer's statement that such unlawful inquiries are "routine" is especially concerning. As the State legislature found when passing the California Values Act:

"A relationship of trust between California's immigrant community and state and local agencies is central to the public safety of the people of California. . . . This trust is threatened when state and local agencies are entangled with federal immigration enforcement, with the result that immigrant community members fear approaching police when they are victims of, and witnesses to, crimes, seeking basic health services, or attending school, to the detriment of public safety and the well-being of all Californians."

Cal. Gov't Code § 7284.2.

As a result of the Tustin police officers' unlawful questioning, Mr. Hernandez Román suffered emotional distress, pain, suffering, trauma, worry, anxiety, humiliation, and embarrassment.

Specify what particular act/omission on the part of City of Tustin officers or employees you claim caused the damage/injury:

By questioning Mr. Hernandez Román about his immigration status, the Tustin Police violated his rights under the California Values Act and caused him emotional distress, pain, suffering, trauma, worry, anxiety, humiliation, and embarrassment. Cal. Gov't Code § 7284.6(a)(1)(A) (prohibiting "inquiring into an individual's immigration status").

Amount claimed and basis for computation:

Mr. Hernandez Román requests the following:

- 1. \$5,000 in compensatory, statutory, treble, and punitive damages for violating his rights under the California Values Act;
- 2. An internal investigation into Tustin Police Department officers responsible for questioning Mr. Hernandez Román about his immigration status, and the release of findings of that investigation to at least Mr. Hernandez Román and his counsel;
- 3. Tustin Police Department's implementation of and compliance with a comprehensive policy consistent with the California Values Act and Truth Act; and
- 4. A training regarding the California Values Act and Truth Act for all Tustin Police Department staff to be conducted in consultation with the ACLU of Southern California.
