

YOUR RIGHTS ON TRAINS AND BUSES

If immigration agents board your bus or train or are patrolling a bus or train station:



YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

remain silent.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

refuse a search.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

record video.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

inform others of their rights!



IMMIGRATION AGENTS ON YOUR BUS

Passengers, you have rights!

- You always have the right to remain silent.
- ⇒ When in doubt, do not answer questions about your citizenship or immigration status or sign any paperwork without the advice of a lawyer. Any information you volunteer to immigration agents can and will be used against you to deport you.
- ⇒ If you have valid immigration papers, you can provide them. Never provide false documents.

- You can ask immigration agents why they're stopping you.
- You have the right to record video of immigration agents. Download ACLU's Mobile Justice CA app for free on iOS or Android. The app lets you record any encounters with law enforcement and sends a copy to the ACLU for review and safekeeping.
- → You can refuse a search of your belongings by saying, "I do not consent to a search."
