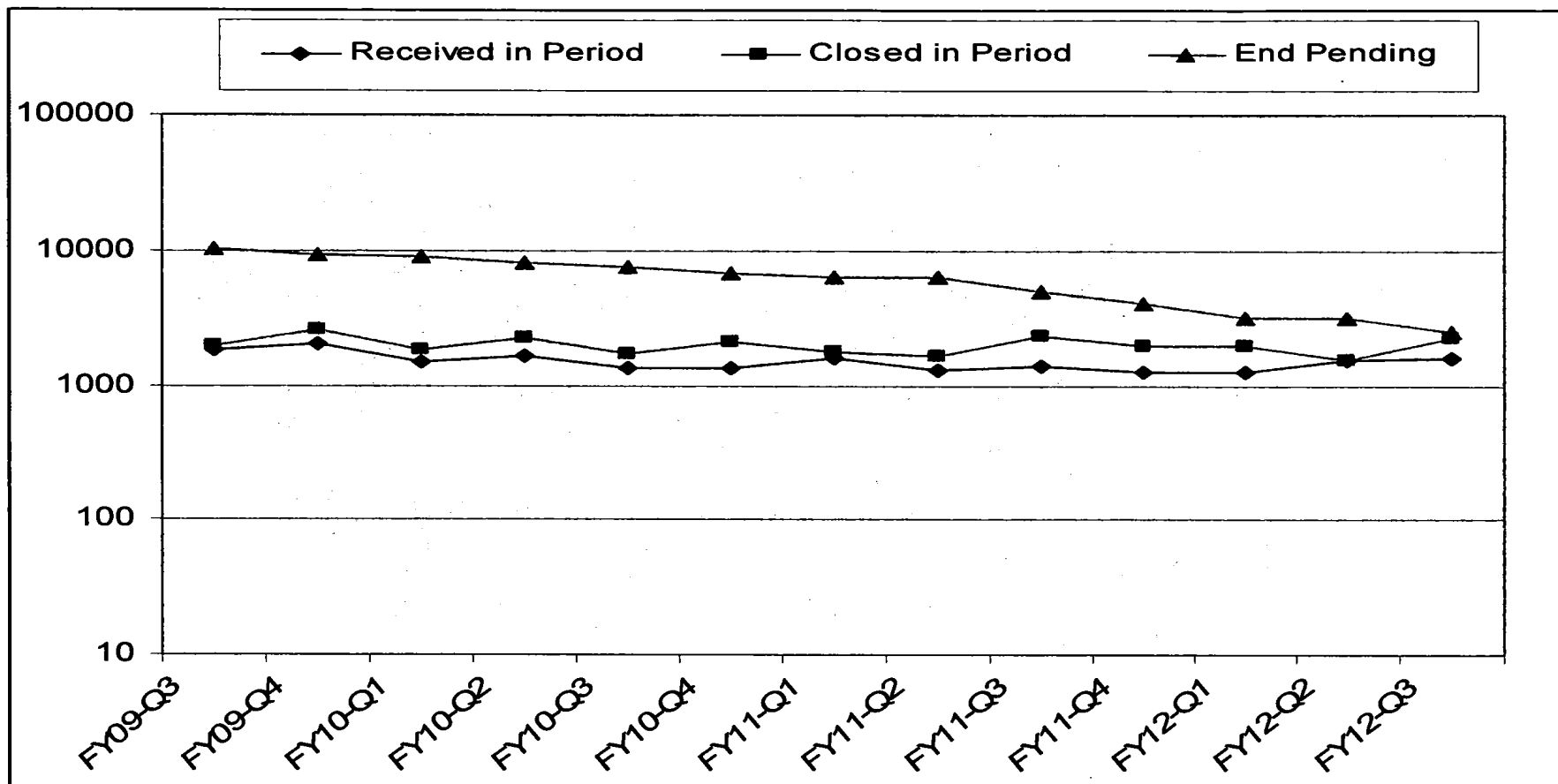

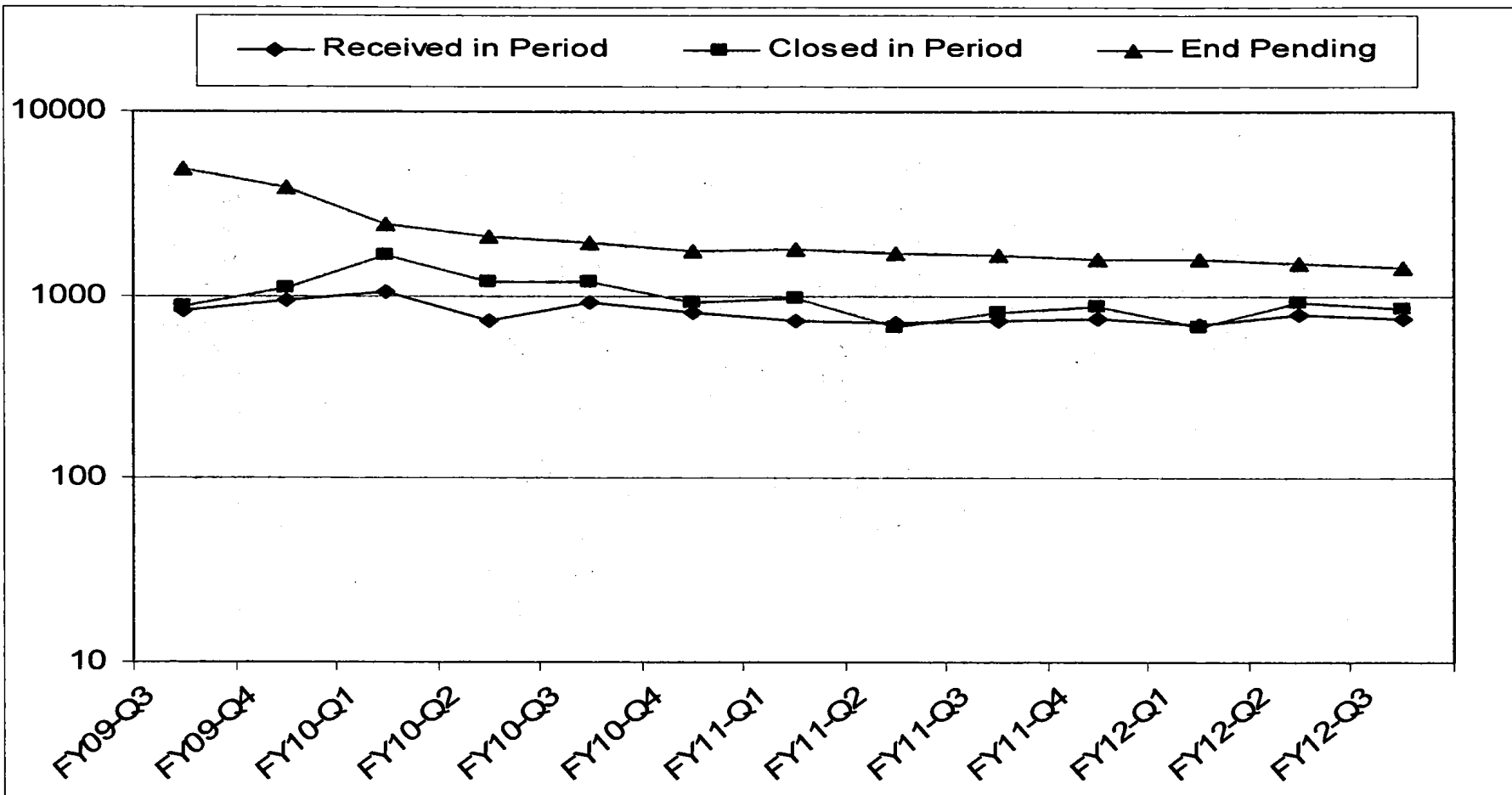
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## NS Subjects Quarterly Workload Progression: Field Ops



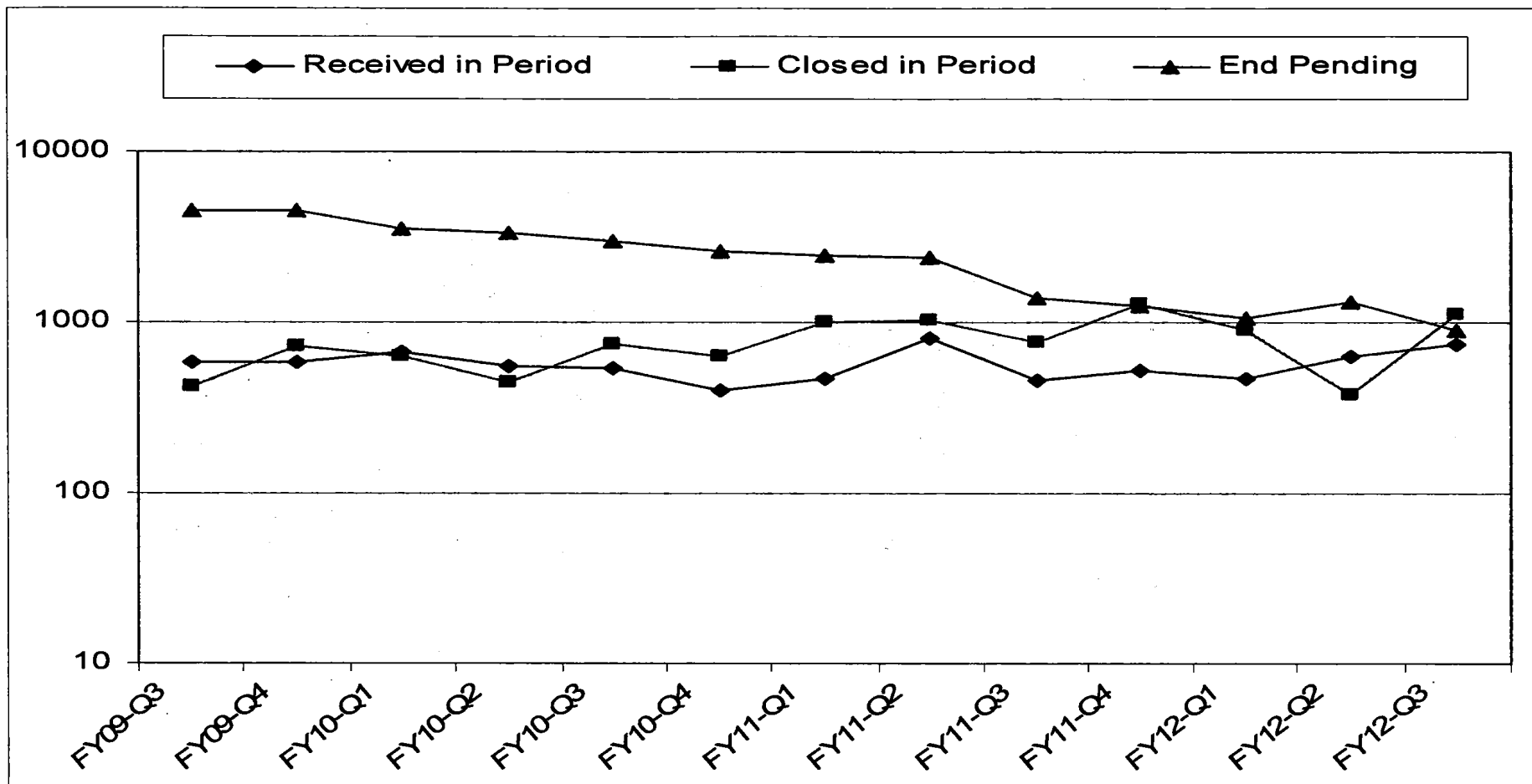

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# NS Subjects Quarterly Workload Progression: SCOPS



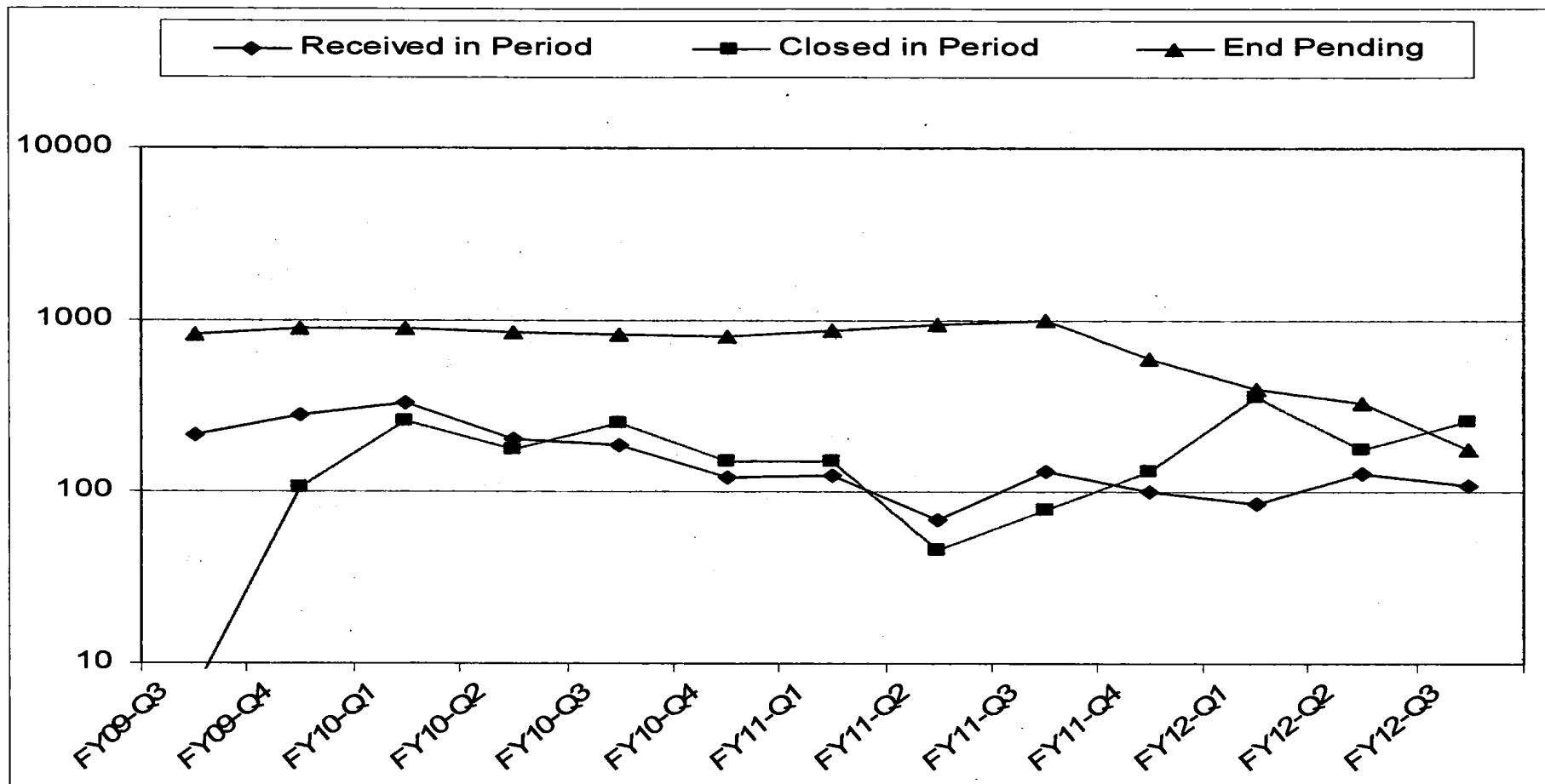
